Winter is the time to plant new paddock

And now, an update from our Coaches (circa Round 16):

Seniors and Reserves

As we enter the final few weeks of the home and away season, the Seniors are essentially set for a finals berth for the first time in just under a decade, and potentially their highest finish (5th) for even longer. Having won 9 of 15 and with very winnable games in Rounds 16 & 17, the likely scenario is we will finish with 11 victories and 5th spot, if other results go as expected. This means, both Seniors and Reserves will play finals together in 2019!

This result is testament to the hard work and effort of the playing group, ably supported by the committee, trainers and coaching staff. Over the past three years, we are probably the most 'under-recruited' Club in the top half of the ladder, relying more upon development from within from loyal, Club/team-first players rather than securing many from premier leagues. Pleasingly, we have had very few players leave us, which means we have maintained a very similar list from season to season and are seen as wonderful Club of which to part.

So far this season, we have achieved major victories over Tarrawingee (2018 Premiers) and Glenrowan (2014-2017 Premiers and proven finals team), with very close results against fellow finals-bound teams Whorouly and King Valley, whom we lost closely to after having substantial leads at some stage after half-time. Certainly, we feel capable of competing strongly against any opposition.




